This book is one of two copies of the 1992 Book of Governors of the USA that were produced and presented by the 305th Bomb Group Memorial Association. This copy was presented to Chelveston-cum-Caldecott Parish Council and the other copy to Higham Ferrers Town Council. These books were presented on the occasion of one of the reunion visits to Chelveston in September 1992, in celebration of 50 years since the USAAF first came to Britain in World War II.

During World War II, the 305th Bombardment Group (Heavy), known as the "Can Do" Group, was stationed at RAF Chelveston (Station 105). As part of the 40th Combat Wing of the 1st Air Division of the US 8th Air Force, the 305th BG(H) consisted of four flying squadrons – the 364th, 365th, 366th and the 422nd. Attached were S2 Intelligence, the 325th Service Group, the 983rd MP Company, the 413th Air Service Group, the 876th Chemical Company, the 1632nd Ordnance MM Company, the 1121st Quarter Master Company and the 2nd Station Complement Squadron. 769 valiant members gave their lives to preserve freedom for all. The Group flew 480 combat missions, with over 174 of their aircraft shot down or destroyed.

A copy of the "Chelveston book" has been made and resides in a display cabinet in the parish church of St John the Baptist at Chelveston. An on-line copy resides on the internet on the Chelveston History website (www.chelveston.org.uk/History).

There is a memorial tablet that was mounted on the external east wall of the Church Tower in September 1980 and in May 2007 a new memorial was completed in the centre of the village beside the B645. The dedication and unveiling was attended by 15 US veterans and 39 family members, watched by approx. 400 members of the public.



Although Alaska was an American territory at that time, our citizens served with the 305th Bombardment Group under the leadership of General Curtis LeMay.


